## Holy Eucharist Rite II

### **Liturgical Notes for Palm Sunday**

Since the 1979 Book of Common Prayer was adopted, the liturgy for Palm Sunday also has included the Passion Gospel, which can be an abrupt transition. To celebrate the day as it happened, we have opted to put the Gospel at the end of the Liturgy.

We begin celebrating the Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem, with palm branches, and then continue with the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Table. The entire service is a high celebration, culminating with Eucharist.

Then, after Eucharist, we enter into the Passion Gospel, experiencing the high drama and deep emotion of the story of Jesus' final days and his death on the Cross. We conclude with silence. Holy Week has begun.

*This morning, the Liturgy begins around the altar for the blessing of the palms and the Palm Sunday procession.*

## Prelude

### Opening Acclamation

*Celebrant:* Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord.

***People:* Peace in heaven and glory in the highest.**

*Celebrant:* Let us pray.

Assist us mercifully with your help, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby you have given us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

### The First Lesson

*Zechariah 9:9-12*

Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. He will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war horse from Jerusalem; and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall command peace to the nations; his dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth. As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your prisoners free from the waterless pit. Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double.

*Celebrant:* The Word of the Lord.

***People:* Thanks be to God.**

### The Blessing of the Palms

*Celebrant:* The Lord be with you.

***People:* And also with you.**

*Celebrant:* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

***People:* It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

It is right to praise you, Almighty God, for the acts of love by which you have redeemed us through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. On this day he entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph, and was proclaimed as King of kings by those who spread their garments and branches of palm along his way. Let these branches be for us signs of his victory, and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who lives and reigns in glory with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen.**

*Philippians 2:5-11*

and became obedient to the point of death--

After telling a parable to the crowd at Jericho, Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it.'" So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" They said, "The Lord needs it." Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying,

"Blessed is the king  
who comes in the name of the Lord!  
Peace in heaven,  
and glory in the highest heaven!"

Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."
